Call to Order: Chairman Geistwhite called the meeting to order at 7:30 a.m. in the Middlesex Township Municipal Building.

Public Comment: None.

Old Business:

On the motion of Chairman Geistwhite, seconded by Supervisor Goodhart, it was unanimously agreed to grant the request by the Estates of Linwood B. Phillips, Jr. and Robert M. Frey to continue the Conditional Use Hearing from October 29, 2021, to December 30, 2021, at 7:30 a.m.

On the motion of Chairman Geistwhite, seconded by Vice-Chairman Larson, it was unanimously agreed to change the December 31, 2021, Workshop Meeting to December 30, 2021, at 7:30 a.m.

New Business:

Due to a recycling facility proposed in Silver Spring Township and the expected traffic impacts in Middlesex Township due to that use, Chairman Geistwhite indicated that it was important that the Supervisors express their concerns about that use to Silver Spring Township. On the motion of Chairman Geistwhite, seconded by Vice-Chairman Larson, it was unanimously agreed to amend the agenda to discuss and consider communicating its position on the issue of a proposed recycling center in Silver Spring Township and the possible impacts to Middlesex Township. After much discussion, the Supervisors were not opposed to the idea, just concerned about the traffic impacts in Middlesex Township.

On the motion of Chairman Geistwhite, seconded by Vice-Chairman Larson, it was unanimously agreed to authorize the Township Solicitor Mr. Brenneman to draft a letter of concern to Silver Spring Township Board of Supervisors regarding the proposed recycling center and the traffic impact it could have on Middlesex Township.

There being no further business, on the motion of Chairman Geistwhite, seconded by Vice-Chairman Larson, it was unanimously agreed to adjourn the meeting at 7:50 a.m.
