CALL TO ORDER AND PLEDGE TO THE FLAG: Chairman Geistwhite called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m. in the Middlesex Township Building, with Director of Public Safety Chief Sherman leading the pledge to the flag.

PUBLIC COMMENT: Mr. Brad Filipovich, 12 Teaberry Drive, inquired as to whose decision it was to not cancel Trick or Treating with the pending weather. Mr. Stanley Tarka, 210 Old Stonehouse Road commented that he has lived in the Township 15 years and never had a trick or treater but that night had two vehicles pull up even with the weather. Chief Sherman stated that many of the neighboring municipalities with the exception of some to the East kept trick or treating as planned. Fire Chief Beam stated that it is more of a safety factor not to change the date.

AUTHORIZE PAYMENT OF BILLS: On the motion of Chairman Geistwhite, seconded by Supervisor Goodhart, it was unanimously agreed to authorize the payments of the November 2019 bills.

Manager – Mrs. Gault reported that Trash/Recycling RFP was advertised for the first time. The staff emailed a copy of it to the potential bidders. Bids are due back December 3rd and will be opened on December 4th.

OLD BUSINESS:

Preliminary/Final Land Development and Subdivision Plans of Burger King & Popeyes Restaurants Request for Extension of Plan Review Time: On the motion of Chairman Geistwhite, seconded by Supervisor Goodhart it was unanimously agreed to approve the request of Charles M. Suhr, Esquire on behalf of the applicant, to grant an extension of the maximum time period for action on the Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan of Burger King & Popeyes Restaurants until March 6, 2020.

Preliminary/Final Land Development and Subdivision Plan for Carlisle Steel Supply, LLC Request for Extension of Plan Review Time: On the motion of Chairman Geistwhite, seconded by Supervisor Goodhart it was unanimously agreed to approve the request of W. John Madden, PE on behalf of the applicant, to grant an extension of the maximum time period for action on the Preliminary/Final Land Development Plan for Carlisle Steel Supply, LLC until February 6, 2020.

NEW BUSINESS:

Barry L. & Linda C. Roush, Request for Waiver of Ordinance #8-2017 Subdivision Plan Requirements to Allow Consolidation of Six Existing Lots Into Two Lots By Deed of Consolidation and Property Survey: On the motion of Chairman Geistwhite, seconded by Supervisor Goodhart, it was unanimously agreed to approve the request of Robert G. Frey, Esquire, on behalf of the applicants, Barry and Linda Roush to waive requirements of the Subdivision and Land Development Ordinance to allow consolidation of the 6 existing lots by deed into 2 larger lots, as shown on the Lot Consolidation Plan submitted with the condition that the plan be recorded with the deeds of consolidation.

2020 Municipal Domestic Animal Protective Services Agreement: On the motion of Chairman Geistwhite, seconded by Supervisor Goodhart, it was agreed to execute the 2020 Municipal Domestic Animal Protective Services Agreement as amended between Middlesex Township and the Humane Society of Harrisburg Area.

The Township Manager Mrs. Gault responded to the comment about trick or treating stating that the Township operates with a small staff and any decision that was made by the staff was done with the best interest of the residents in mind.

There being no further business, on the motion of Chairman Geistwhite, seconded by Supervisor Goodhart, it was unanimously agreed to adjourn the meeting at 7:30 p.m.
