

TOWNSHIP OF MIDDLESEX
CUMBERLAND COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA
ORDINANCE NO. 4 OF 1990

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PARKING OF
VEHICLES ON CERTAIN ROADS AND HIGHWAYS OR
PORTIONS THEREOF, PROVIDING FOR THE ERECTION
OF SIGNS, AND ESTABLISHING PENALTIES FOR
VIOLATION THEREOF

WHEREAS, the Township of Middlesex is a Local Authority
under the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code (Act of June 17, 1976, P.L.
162, No. 81), as amended [75 Pa. C.S.A. 101 et seq.]) having
certain roads or highways under its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, said Township of Middlesex has conducted all
necessary engineering and traffic investigation incidental to
its exercise of authority hereunder; and

WHEREAS, the Township of Middlesex deems it in the best
interest of its residents and the users of certain roads and
highways within said Township to prohibit the parking (including
standing and stopping) of vehicles on certain roads and highways;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED and it is
hereby enacted and ordained by the Board of Township Supervisors
in and for the Township of Middlesex, Cumberland County,
Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION 1: PREAMBLE AND POLICY

The foregoing paragraphs or preamble are incorporated
herein as the background and policy of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2: DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION

Words and phrases used in this Ordinance shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code (Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162, Ho. 81), as amended, except that in this Ordinance the word "road" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway" and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.

SECTION 3: PARKING PROHIBITED ALONG OR ON CERTAIN ROADS AND HIGHWAYS AND PENALTIES THEREFOR

(a) It shall be unlawful for any person at any time to park a vehicle on the following roads and highways and the sides, berms or shoulders thereof:

(1) Both sides of Conrad Road between Claremont Drive and the point or curve where Conrad Road turns toward Trindle Road;

(2) Both sides of Clinton Drive between Harrisburg Pike (U.S. Route No. 11) and South Letort Drive;

(3) Both sides of Spring Road (Pa. Route No. 34) from the Middlesex Township-North Middleton Township municipal boundary line to a point seven hundred (700) feet therefrom.

(4) Both sides of Bernheisel Bridge Road from a point six hundred (600) feet north of the bridge over the Conodoguinet Creek to a point five hundred fifty (550) feet south of said bridge.

(5) Both sides of Harrisburg Pike (U.S. Route No. 11) between Country Club Road and the Middlesex Township-Silver Spring Township municipal boundary line.

(6) Both sides of Harrisburg Pike (U.S. Route No. 11) between Wolf's Bridge Road and the

Middlesex Township-North Middleton Township
municipal boundary line.

(7) Both sides of Carolina Way between
Harrisburg Pike (U.S. Route No. 11) and the
Carolina Freight terminal building.

(8) Both sides of Maple Drive between
Harrisburg Pike (U.S. Route No. 11) and Willow
View Drive.

(9) Both sides of Conrad Drive between
Claremont Drive and the stop intersection of
Summit Drive.

(10) Both sides of North Middlesex Road
between the bridge over the Conodoguinet Creek
and Clemson Drive.

(b) It shall be unlawful for any person between
December 1 of any year and April 1 of the succeeding
year to park a vehicle within any portion of the cul-
de-sac ends or areas of the following roads and
highways: Birch Road, Oak Ridge Road, Shover Drive,
Roadway Drive, Wildrose Circle, Barley Field, Pin Oak
Drive, Evergreen Lane, Hawthorne Road, Shellbark
Court, Oak Lane Drive, Spruce Lane, Chestnut Drive
and Ironstone Drive.

(c) Appropriate signs shall be posted at the
areas where parking is prohibited.

(d) The term "park" shall be construed to
include the terms "park" or "parking", "stand" or
"standing" and "stop" or "stopping".

(e) The Middlesex Township Police Department is
authorized and empowered to physically remove any

vehicle which is parked, stopped or standing in violation of this ordinance and to impound the same in the custody of the Township of Middlesex. Any costs of removal shall be paid by the owner of the vehicle, which costs shall be a lien on the vehicle during its impoundment.

(f) Any person who violates any provision of this Section shall upon conviction before a District Justice, be sentenced to pay a fine of Fifteen (\$15.00) Dollars.

SECTION 4: SEVERABILITY

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional, illegal or otherwise invalid, that decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. It is declared to be the legislative intention that this Ordinance would have been enacted had the unconstitutional, illegal or otherwise invalid provisions not been included in the Ordinance.

SECTION 5: CONTINUATION OF EXISTING REGULATIONS

The provisions of this Ordinance insofar as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this Ordinance are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances and regulations. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect any act done or any suit

or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any earlier ordinances or regulations repealed or superseded hereby.

SECTION 6: REPEAL OF CERTAIN PRIOR ORDINANCES

All prior ordinances of this Township insofar as they deal with the precise subject matter of this Ordinance are repealed and declared to be unenforceable insofar as they are inconsistent with any provisions of this Ordinance.

SECTION 7: EFFECTIVE DATE

This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with existing law.
