ORDINANCE NO. 5 -2001

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A STOP INTERSECTION AT
THE INTERSECTION OF ROADWAY DRIVE AND THE DRIVEWAY
SERVICING THE PROPERTY COMMONLY KNOWN AS 100
ROADWAY DRIVE, CARLISLE, PENNSYLVANIA PRESENTLY
OCCUPIED BY ROADWAY EXPRESS

WHEREAS, the Township of Middlesex is a Local Authority under the Pennsylvania
Vehicle Code (Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162, No. 81), as amended (75 Pa.C.S.A. 101, et seq.)
having certain roads or highways under its jurisdiction; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 3363 of said Vehicle Code, said Township of Middlesex
has caused certain engineering and traffic investigations to be made of certain of its roads or
highways; and

WHEREAS, said investigations have determined that certain intersections require traffic
control in order to promote safety to vehicular and pedestrian travel;

WHEREAS, said Township of Middlesex deems it in the best interest of its residents and
the users of said roads or highways to control certain intersections by "stop signs";

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ENACTED AND ORDAINED and it is hereby enacted and
ordained by the Board of Supervisors in and for Middlesex Township, Cumberland County,
Pennsylvania, as follows:

SECTION 1: PREAMBLE AND POLICY.

The foregoing paragraphs and preamble are incorporated herein as the background and
policy of this Ordinance.

SECTION 2: DEFINITIONS AND INTERPRETATION.

Words and phrases used in this Ordinance shall have the meanings ascribed to them in the Pennsylvania Vehicle Code (Act of June 17, 1976, P.L. 162, No. 81) as amended, except that in this Ordinance the word "road" may be used interchangeably with the word "highway" and shall have the same meaning as the word "highway" as defined in the Vehicle Code.

SECTION 3: STOP INTERSECTION ESTABLISHED AND PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF

(a) The intersection of the driveway servicing the property presently occupied by Roadway Express, which property is commonly known as 100 Roadway Drive and Roadway Drive (T- 520), a public township road, is hereby established as a stop intersection, at which an official stop sign ("sign") shall be erected within the legal right-of-way limits of the road and positioned on the east side of said driveway to stop traffic approaching Roadway Drive from the south.

(b) Every driver of a vehicle approaching the above mentioned intersection in the direction indicated in subsection (a) shall stop the vehicle as required by Section 3323(b) of the Vehicle Code and shall not proceed into, through or across said intersection of streets or roads until he/she has followed all applicable requirements of that section of the Code.

(c) Any person who violates any provision of this Section, shall, upon conviction before a District Justice, be sentenced to pay a fine of Twenty-five (\$25.00) Dollars.

SECTION 4: APPLICABILITY OF ORDINANCE REGARDLESS OF FUTURE USE, OCCUPANCY, OR CHANGE OF ADDRESS OF PROPERTY

The provisions of this Ordinance shall remain applicable and enforceable regardless of the change in occupancy, use or common name of the property presently known as 100 Roadway Drive, it being the intent of this Ordinance to, inter alia, regulate the intersection described in Section 3(a) above as a stop intersection regardless of how or by whom said property providing access onto Roadway Drive is in the future used, occupied, or commonly named or identified.

SECTION 5: SEVERABILITY.

The provisions of this Ordinance shall be severable, and if any of its provisions shall be held to be unconstitutional, illegal or otherwise invalid, that decision shall not affect the validity of any of the remaining provisions of this Ordinance. It is declared to be the legislative intention that this Ordinance would have been enacted had the unconstitutional, illegal or otherwise invalid provisions not been included in the Ordinance.

SECTION 6: CONTINUATION OF EXISTING REGULATIONS.

The provisions of this Ordinance insofar as they are the same as those of ordinances and regulations in force immediately before the enactment of this Ordinance are intended as a continuation of those earlier ordinances and regulations. Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect any act done or any suit or prosecution pending or to be instituted under any earlier ordinances or regulations repealed or superseded hereby.

SECTION 7: REPEAL OF CERTAIN PRIOR ORDINANCES.

All prior ordinances of Middlesex Township insofar as they deal with the precise subject matter of this Ordinance are repealed and declared to be unenforceable insofar as they are

inconsistent with any provisions of this Ordinance.

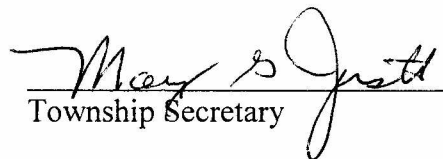
SECTION 8: EFFECTIVE DATE.

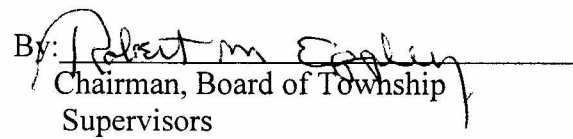
This Ordinance shall take effect in accordance with existing law.
